


Have Your Say:



Sydney Metro Temporary Works Compound – Compulsory Acquisition of Council Land

Dear Resident,

Council has been notified by Sydney Metro that they require land to be used for a works compound for the construction of the Sydenham to Bankstown Metro. They will require the land for four years during construction between 2020 to 2024.

Sydney Metro identified the following three local parks for compulsory acquisition (refer to attached map on other side):

- A) Heynes Reserve 60 Berna Street, Canterbury;
- B) Little Tasker Park 1 East Parade, Campsie; and
- C) Ewen Park Tennent Parade, Hurlstone Park 3000m2 compound

All three parks are required by Sydney Metro and Council does not have the ability to refuse any compulsory acquisition by the State Government.

At the May Council meeting, Council considered this request and put forward a single alternative site at:

• 15 Close Street, Canterbury – the former Canterbury Bowling Club site that is no longer operating – (refer to attached map on other side).

15 Close Street was recommended as it is currently not accessible to the general community and has direct access to the rail corridor. This site was considered to have less overall impact than the alternative loss of open space from the other three sites.

At the Council meeting it was recommended that further information be provided by Sydney Metro on the possible impacts of siting the works compound on Close Street.

Council is seeking feedback on the current Sydney Metro proposal (use of all three parks) as well as Council's proposed alternative site at 15 Close Street.

As this matter is to be considered again at the **23 June** Council meeting, Council is seeking feedback by **Monday 22 June**.




